
THE U.S. OPIOID EPIDEMIC

Prescribing patterns have led to an increased availability of opioids and the potential overuse and misuse by patients and others who beg, borrow, or steal the opioids from the intended patient.

Multiple opioid interventions are required to combat the epidemic.

THE CALL FOR OPIOID INTERVENTION

- Since 1999, overdose deaths involving opioids have quadrupled, and sales of opioids have almost quadrupled.
- More than six out of every ten drug overdose deaths involve an opioid.
- On an average day, 3,900 people initiate nonmedical use of prescription opioids and 78 people die from an opioid-related overdose.

USE DATA & ANALYTICS TO INFORM STRATEGIES AT REDUCE OPIOID AVAILABILITY.

- № 980,527 fewer opioid pills prescribed in the outpatient setting in 2016, a 12% relative reduction.
- 2,079 fewer patients receiving ≥8 opioid pill prescriptions over 12 months, an 18.1% relative. reduction.

ADOPT PRESCRIPTION DRUG MONITORING PROGRAMS TO PREVENT MISUSE.

STATE SUCCESSES: **IF ACTION:** New York required prescribers to check the state's prescription drug

- monitoring program before prescribing painkillers. **RESULT:** Saw a 75% drop in patients who were seeing multiple prescribers to


IF ACTION: Tennessee required prescribers to check the state's prescription drug
